SESSION NEWS and NOTES

The Session of Clifton Presbyterian Church, Maxwelton, WV, met for the stated January meeting on Sunday January 12, 2020 at 12: 20 p.m. in the Conference Room of the church.

Those in attendance were moderator, Susan Sharp Campbell; temporary pastor, Ron Miller; session members: Teresa Bostic, Jim Miller, Suzy Meadows, Carol Hoover, Larry Davis, Lynne Bostic and Houston Arbuckle. Venetta Wright and Kereshmeh Kashefian were excused. Our newly appointed moderator, Susan Sharp Campbell, opened the meeting with prayer and declared a quorum. Houston Arbuckle was elected for another year as Clerk of Session. Pastor Ron Miller discussed his hopes and plans for the coming months.

The financial report for December 2019 was received: The General fund showed an excess income of \$5,328.37. The General now has a balance of \$198,112.54. The Memorial fund received \$20.00 from donations and \$275.00 for poinsettias, the poinsettias cost \$270.00 leaving a balance of \$45,769.82. Cents-Ability offering was \$97.50 and \$200 was donated to the "Joy Gift" offering. Stone Soup fund had a balance \$3,569.10.

The Clerk reported the average worship attendance for December 2019 was about **51.** The next Presbytery meeting will be February 15th in St. Albans. **Larry Davis** was elected Commissioner.

The Clerk had received from the Presbytery the Shared Mission Benevolence request for 2020 of \$2,295.00. The session approved the request. **Houston Arbuckle, clerk of session**, moved to approve the committees and chairs for 2020, noting that each chair had accepted the assignment. The session approved the committees listed in this "Messenger"

Administration Committee: The session and Rev. Miller renewed their Covenant Agreement until January 31, 2021. The contract includes: the possible termination with 30 days' notice by either party; the duties of the pastor will be to conduct worship, call on sick and home-bound, officiate at weddings and funerals, work with committees and represent the church when asked by the session. The salary is \$2,000.00 per month with vacation and study leave as required by the Presbytery.

Suzy Meadows, Chair of the Education Committee gave session members information about the Matthew 25 program of the PCUSA. The session voted for Clifton to become a Matthew 25 church.

The Worship Committee hopes to use volunteer liturgists in our worship services. All those interested may sign up and help lead worship in this way. The Worship Committee recommended and the session approved the following communion dates: February 23, 2020, Transfiguration Sunday; February 26, 2020, Ash Wednesday; and October 4, 2020, Worldwide Communion day.

The session also approved the purchase of 20 more hymn books.

Larry Davis, Chair of the Mission Committee reported the "Helping Hands" donations had been \$751. The mission committee approved adding \$149 form its 2020 budget in order to donate \$300 for student's needs to each of the following schools: Lewisburg Elementary, Frankford Elementary and Crichton Elementary. Mission Committee approved \$200 from the "Stone Soup Fund" in December. \$3,650.10 for local mission and \$1,800 for global mission were donated from the church's budget during 2019.

Kereshmeh Kashefian, Chair of the Outreach

<u>Committee</u> is using our face book page to communicate with both members and the community. Rev. Miller's sermons and the "Clifton Messenger" can be seen on this site.

In <u>NEW BUSINESS</u> each session member was given a "budget work sheet" which included the 2019 budget and the 2019 expenses. The 2020 budget will be considered at the next session meeting on February 2, 2020.

Pastoral concerns of the church were discussed and **Susan Sharp Campbell** adjourned the meeting with the prayer.

Clifton Mission's Committee at Work




Helping Hands Donation: Larry Davis & Joanne Persinger of Mission Committee with Donna Nickell, Principal Crichton Elem. School

2020 Clifton Committees



Most of the work and planning of the church is done through its committees. We are always looking for ways to enrich our committees with fresh faces and new ideas. Below you will find information on the responsibilities of each committee and who to contact to become more involved.

Administration Committee is responsible for church-staff relations, personnel evaluations, and for maintaining the operation of the church office, as well as assisting the bookkeeper with collecting, counting, and disturbing the church's money. They will recommend both a church treasurer and a firm to conduct the annual audit. This committee will serve as a forum to listen to any grievance by the members or the staff or the congregation. Chairs: Houston Arbuckle & Teresa Bostic

The Property Committee is responsible for the maintenance, repair and use of the church's facilities, vehicles and grounds. Chair: Jim Miller

The Christian Education Committee will oversee and support educational opportunities and programs for all members

of the church. This committee is responsible for securing and training leadership, as well as procuring appropriate curriculum and necessary supplies for all educational activities of the church. The Christian Education Committee is thus responsible for the Sunday church school; non-Sunday educational activities; Vacation Bible School; youth groups; the nursery, including proper staff and equipment; and maintaining the church library. Chair: Suzy Meadows

Congregational Care Committee has the goal of seeing that the spiritual, emotional, and physical needs of each member, especially those who are home-bound, <u>infirm</u>, <u>or with special needs</u> is met to best of our church's ability. Effective communication is essential in seeing that no one goes "unnoticed". The duties of this committee may include: noting persons absent from worship for extended periods, sharing information in the newsletter, informing the pastor and session of those in need of care, establishing visitation programs, updating a church's directory, and assisting in coordinating the church's response in situations of crisis for members. Chair: Lynne Bostic

The Fellowship Committee provides fellowship opportunities and events which bring church members and guest together in order to strengthen our relationship with each other and with God. This includes fellowship time, dinners, parties, retreats and picnics in the park. Chair: Carol Hoover

Mission Committee is charged with the task of developing and supporting local and global mission projects. Chair: **Dr. Larry Davis**

Outreach Committee strives to communicate with the congregation and the surrounding community. The committee oversees the website, Facebook, informational brochures, the church newsletter, publicity for special events and other special communicates directed by the session. The committee shall also note persons visiting at worship, informing the pastor and helping with follow-up contacts. Chair: Kereshmeh Kashefian
